- 2. Provide a brief profile of the organization(s) involved in the proposal, including basic information such as the year it was founded, mission statement, summary of staff, and size of the annual budget.
- 3. Why is this project important to you?
- 4. What goals do you hope to achieve?
- 5. When do you anticipate your project will begin, and when will it conclude?
- 6. Describe in detail your qualifications to undertake this project.

- 7. How does this project relate to your own experiences?
- 8. Discuss your financial needs and detail other sources of support (if any). What alternative sources of funding are you or have you pursued? What are other long-term possible sources of support?
- 9. What percentage of your budget is earmarked for salaries, stipends, and/or benefits? Wall Award funds may be used for these purposes, but the committee is interested in knowing exactly how much will go towards this area.
- 10. As applicable, what is the relevant research that supports your proposal? Though this is not a research brief, the committee is interested in any academic work that supports your model.
- 11. How will you document your accomplishments?

Project Budget

Please provide a proposed budget for the project, not exceeding two pages.

Please note in your budget that the Wall Service Award is awarded to you as an individual, which means you pay the taxes on that money. The financial award is distributed over two tax years. If you have never written a grant application, the selection committee encourages you to find a mentor who can provide you with feedback and guidance on the process.
